### LEGISLATIVE REPORT JUNE 2024

We had a great 25th Annual "Mike Sloan" Memorial Motorcycle Awareness and You Rally and thank you everyone that came to support this wonderful event. I'm not sure of the total number that showed up but we had between 35-40 bikes and I got to see my old friend and brother Steve Zimmer. It was great to see him. We ended up with several Representatives and Senators that came out to support the event and say a few words, a few just came out and hung around for a bit with us and talk to a few members. It turned out to be a great day. Thank you again everyone that came out and a big thank you to all the Representatives and Senators that came out and spoke to us. A special thank you to Tricia Ruby, Deanna Rhodes-Widmer and Tony Sheppard.

Now on to legislation, which isn't looking very good right now but we still have two weeks left as of this writing. Most all the legislation we have been following this year has had a hearing and voted out of committee with a "do pass" vote. What that means is that if a piece of legislation comes up for debate on the house floor the Representative has a chance to amend their legislation to that legislation as long as it falls under the title of the legislation. Most all of the legislation we have been following is in the House. So now it's a waiting game to see if anything can be amended later in session, I'm not holding my breath but I'm hopeful something happens with some of it. Legislation that Deanna has been working on, a veterans omnibus bill, SB 912, is close to the finish line but still needs to be voted out of the House and will probably end up in conference committee. There's a lot of good stuff in the bill for our vets and I hope it crosses the finish line.

That's about it for this month and I will wrap up the session next time. I will be giving out a list of the legislation at the CC meeting this weekend and it's up to all of you to contact your Legislators and get support behind the legislation we have been supporting.

You all stay safe out there and arrive alive. Just an FYI as of April 29th the state has experienced 26 motorcycle fatalities, 17 with helmets and 7 without and 2 unknown. These data are well above where we were three to four years ago.

# **Motorcycle Awareness**

Motorcycle Awareness doesn't just begin and end with one individual, it takes the whole brother/ sisterhood to make sure motorcyclists are seen. That starts with being proactive when we are out riding. If we as a brother/sisterhood are not paying attention to each other, then how can we expect the vehicles around us? Obeying traffic laws is a major part of motorcycle safety and awareness. Do we really need to eek through that yellow/orange light? Do we really need those last alcohol drinks that put us just over the edge to be reckless? The answer is no. Plain and simple. If we cannot or will not watch out for each other, then no one else will.

Motorcycles pose unique safety concerns (not only for motorcyclists but for everyone on the road). However, by educating yourself about the issues and concerns surrounding motorcycle accidents, you can keep the US's roadways much safer. Here are seven key facts about motorcycle accidents that every motorist should know:

They can lead to large settlements. Motorcycle accidents are often brutal. When you're harmed on a motorcycle due to someone else's reckless actions or are harmed by a reckless motorcyclist, you deserve to find restitution for your pain and suffering. These lawsuits can lead to big settlements that can get victims' lives back on track. While it's difficult to pinpoint the exact average motorcycle accident settlement, they tend to be much larger than many other types of auto accidents. The more vigilant you are about getting a motorcycle accident lawyer in the aftermath of an accident, the more effectively you'll be able to gain a large settlement that can help you move on with your life in a dignified and financially secure fashion.

Many of them happen in cities. Urban roads are host to the majority of motorcycle-involved accidents. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has calculated that more than sixty percent of accidents involving motorcycles happen on urban roads and within city limits. For this reason, both motorists and motorcyclists must take extra precautions when driving in these often more crowded and chaotic urban environments. Doing so can save lives and will help keep people in cities feeling safer about hopping on their motorcycles in the coming decades.

Safety gear is crucial. While many people assume motorcycle accidents are so dangerous that safety gear does not make a significant difference, this is actually a dangerous and consequential lie. Safety gear helps reduce the instance of major injuries and death in motorcycle accidents by a significant margin. Over fifty percent of those that die in motorcycle accidents failed to wear their helmets. Wearing other safety gear can prevent broken bones, irreparable scrape injuries, and other nasty injuries as well. For this reason, many states and local jurisdictions have made it a crime to ride a motorcycle without safety gear. Many of these laws only deal with helmets, but some go even further.

Short trips are often the most dangerous. While many people think accidents tend to happen on longer trips and commutes, the opposite is actually true. Motorcycle accidents are especially commonplace during short trips and commutes. While this statistic does not have concrete reasoning driving it, many researchers suspect that drivers are simply less cautious when they know they will only be on the road for a short amount of time. To keep everyone on the roadway around you safe, you should be alert, attentive, and cautious anytime you're behind the wheel (even if you're simply leaving a parking lot).

Substance abuse is more common in motorcycle accidents. Unfortunately, motorcycle accidents have much higher rates of being fueled by substance abuse issues. Alcohol is especially prevalent when looking at the causes and influencing factors behind motorcycle accidents. Nearly one-third of motorcycle accidents involve some type of impairment, in fact. Alcohol is the most predominant substance to blame, but other substances are frequently involved as well. If you or a loved one are struggling with substance abuse issues, it's important to remember that there is help out there. Gaining control over your life will improve your quality of life significantly and keep your community much safer.

Motorcycle accidents are incredibly dangerous. Compared to other motorists, motorcyclists are up to thirty times more likely to die when involved in a collision or other accident. Because a person often gets thrown from a motorcycle during an accident (especially at high speeds), the chance of a major injury occurring greatly increased. If the motorcycle hits a larger vehicle, the chance of major injury or death becomes that much higher. To keep motorcyclists safe, everyone needs to learn to care for every other driver on the road in their immediate area at all times.

















### National and Regional News

Pickerington, Ohio — In the wake of the most recent tragedy involving a fatal collision between a Tesla vehicle in autopilot mode and a motorcyclist in Washington state, the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) once again urges the Department of Transportation (DOT) to strengthen Automated Driving System (ADS) regulations. The incident, which resulted in the death of the rider, underscores the urgent need for specific regulations that require that both recognition and reaction to motorcycles be fully integrated into crash avoidance and autonomous vehicle (AV) technologies to ensure safety for motorcyclists and drivers.

In February of 2022, the AMA — along with the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC) and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) — sat down to share industry priorities with United States DOT Secretary Pete Buttigieg and department staff. One of the key discussion points during that meeting was the need to ensure that these new automated vehicle and crash avoidance technologies are required to recognize and react appropriately to motorcycles.

Previously, the AMA had discussed concerns about autonomous vehicles with former DOT Secretary Elaine Chao, as well. But while the AMA has had an audience with DOT officials — and despite NHTSA's investigation into Tesla's Autopilot system and California putting the brakes on AV technology at the state level — no concrete action has been taken at the federal level.

In fact, the most recent testing of these systems by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) indicates only one of the first 10 small SUVs evaluated using their new testing criteria earned a good rating. Four of the tested vehicles either completely failed to provide sufficient warning or gave it too late to avoid a collision.

The AMA reaffirms its commitment to advocating for the safety of motorcyclists on the road and calls upon federal agencies, automakers, technology companies and software developers to ensure that AV technology is thoroughly vetted and capable of protecting all road users, including motorcyclists.

### Another Biker Killed By Tesla Utilizing Automated Driving Mode



Once again, Tesla is in the news and there is tragic news for bikers. A fatal crash involving a motorcyclist and Tesla near Seattle, WA, made national news when the driver of the Tesla admitted the incident occurred while the Tesla was operating in "autopilot" mode. According to the police report, the driver looked down at his phone, " the next thing he knew there was a bang and the vehicle lurched forward as it accelerated and collided with the motorcycle in front of him," killing the motorcyclist.

When will policymakers wake up and realize lives are at stake?

Just last week, a group of six (6) U.S. Senators sent a letter to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) on this exact topic. The letter, led by Ed Markey (D-MA), outlined several growing concerns with this new technology. The letter dated April 18th states,

"We remain concerned that Autopilot, and features like it in other vehicles, could lead drivers to become overconfident and distracted, putting them and other road users at risk."

We at the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) wholeheartedly agree! For years bikers have sounded the alarm about the deployment of these vehicles on our roadways.

During meetings with NHTSA, the MRF has complained about the marketing of these vehicles, which can lead to disastrous results like the one seen in Washington State. It appears that some in Washington, D.C. are starting to take notice. The letter also points out that,

"Drivers who utilize partially automated systems often become distracted or unaware of road risks due to overconfidence or overreliance on the system. In fact, many consumers are confused about or misunderstand the limits of partially automated driving systems, sometimes due to manufacturers' misleading names for these systems."

Thank you to Senators Markey, Richard Blumenthal (D-CT), Peter Welch (D-VT), Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), Ben Ray Lujan (D-NM) and Bernie Sanders (I-VT) for raising these issues with NHTSA.

The MRF is working on a similar version of this letter from lawmakers in the U.S. House of Representatives. Stay tuned for how you can educate your member of Congress on this issue.

Let's not forget what former NHTSA official Missy Cummings said last year, "It's very dangerous for motorcycles to be around Teslas."


