#### 2015 FEW Seminar

Okay folks it's time to throw it into overdrive and begin the preparations for the 2015 FEW Seminar. With all the other major events FORR has had on its plate, this committee has been sharing their time and energy but it's time to turn our attention to the first chapter of 2015.

This year's theme is Where Do We Go From Here? In 2014 we learned where we came from and saw a renewal of the spirit which founded Freedom of Road Riders. 2015 will allow us to bring to the table all we've learned from events such as the Meeting of the Minds and Mid-south Mile. Knowledge is power and in this case we've had the opportunity to network with like minds from around the globe. The FEW is a membership event and this is our opportunity to share wisdom from some of the finest legislative advocates available in any motorcycle rights organization.

The location has been secured at the VFW Post 280, 1509 Ashley Street, Columbia Missouri. Last year we saw record attendance to the point of not having any more room to set up tables. This location is larger and includes a back area suitable for setting up the auction items. In short, we won't be stacking people like cord wood you'll actually be able to sit a table to eat instead of balancing your plate and hoping the food makes it to your mouth.

Speaking of food, the VFW offers breakfast at \$5.00 until 11:00 am. In past years we have had to use the catering services of the hosting facility, not so for 2015. While this gives us flexibility in what we eat it also presents a couple of challenges. Breakfast and dinner are covered but if we wish to offer lunch to allow everyone to visit and play games during this break period we will have to consider whether or not to approach a local business for instance a motorcycle dealership or plan on having it catered. Dinner will be provided by the VFW, and the menu will be similar to last years with the exception of desert - angel food cake with topping! The decision on the color of patches has been made and the choice is; red, white and blue. Helen Wesson of L10 is the creative genius behind this choice. We have no doubt they will represent everything FORR and the FEW are all about. Because we ran short and the volunteers had to sell their own patches we've decided to order 100 for 2015. We will also have leftover patches available from previous years for those wishing to update any they may have missed. Debra John, L31 has volunteered to cover the sale of patches and she'll be set up at a table close to registration.

Registration will again be handled by J. Jack Flagg and his lady of L25. Pre-registration remains at \$15.00 per person up to December 15, 2014, this will include the seminar, banquet, auctions and entertainment. I do not like the cold! LOL! So, if you are like me, then remember to take the time and put away everything with a little due diligence. Put your bike in for service if it needs it. Check the trickle charger and make sure it works. Waterproof your equipment and store it for the winter. Do whatever it takes to protect your investment and prepare for the next riding season.

Fall is also the season for animals. They are storing up for the winter

or trying to move away from the hunters. If you are out on the roads, use a little caution. Drive slower than normal. A few extra minutes could save your life. Just the other night when we were going home, I encountered no less than six deer on the side of the road. One of them was even lying in the middle of the road. (I think it was soaking up the heat from the concrete.) Then there were the armadillos, the possum, the raccoon, and the unidentified animal that just stared at me as I drove by. Lots of opportunity there for some damage if I had not been going slower than normal. If you find yourself out after dark on your bike, give yourself a few extra minutes and take your time riding home. Arriving late is better than not arriving at all!

Fall is also the time for extreme changes in the weather; warm and sunny when you leave, rain during the ride, and cold when you get there. Take the time to pack the extra gear. We all know what it is like in Missouri – if you do not like the weather now, wait a little bit – it will change. Packing the leathers, your warm gloves, the rain gear, or an extra coat may seem silly when the temperature is 80 degrees, but it may be a life saver when you get to your destination.

The October Halloween Bash is coming up. We are going to need volunteers. We are looking for someone to take the lead on the Haunted House. There is a need for trailers, tractors and volunteers. We could also use some people with great imaginations who are willing to set up an area on the hay ride. Do not forget that we also need candy to give out to the kids. This is one of the few events that we do where we give the proceeds to the Shriners for the children. It takes all of us to pull off an event of this size. The more people that help, the better the event is. Officer elections are coming up, so start thinking of who you would like to nominate and vote for. 


OK I know what I'm about to say will probably rub a few of you the wrong way but maybe, just maybe if you take a moment to think about it you'll also understand why these issues are like a bur under the saddle. I got the most recent issue of Motorcycle Consumer News and what's on the front cover but a pic of the Polaris Slingshot. The article is in my opinion appropriately titled "The outrageous Polaris Slingshot". This vehicle is legally classified as a motorcycle but in my opinion is anything but a motorcycle. It has three wheels, two in front and one behind. Side by side seating. The controls of a car - steering wheel, foot controlled clutch, brake and throttle and a center mounted gearshift. It also has conventional shoulder/lap seat belts. Rack and pinion steering, 105" wheelbase; weighs in at 1,743# for the standard model, has a car based four cylinder engine and has the driver err rider sitting a mere 11.5# off the road. What it doesn't have is a roof, windshield or doors. But my question to all of you is this - Is this a motorcycle? Should it be licensed and titled as one? Should they be included in motorcycle statistics? What about motorcycle license endorsement on one of these? Yeah brings up a lot of guestions doesn't it. Right now the definition of a motorcycle is pretty vague and manufacturers are using the vagueness to come up with vehicles that can be classified as motorcycles (which by the way have different emission standards than cars, in many states, Missouri included, don't fall under lemon laws, may be a way to get the motorcycling public on to something "safer", etc....) but which may not be the standard two wheeled "motorcycle" we're all use to. Get where I'm going with this. I sure hope so because in my opinion this is something we really need to be concerned about. I know the MRF has looked at the definition of a motorcycle issue in the past and hasn't been able to come up with a good definition. Maybe it's time we all put our heads together on this and helped them define what is and is not a motorcycle.

Now on to issue number two and it's along the same lines as the other one. I was on my way to work the other morning and just at the top of the exit ramp there was an accident. Unfortunately it involved someone

on two wheels and a car. From all appearances the car made a left turn in front of the two wheeler but that's another story all together. What I want to talk about is the nature of the two wheeler. It was a small scooter. The back of the vehicle was facing me and there was no license plate on it. Didn't see any indication the rider was wearing a helmet. In fact the rider was wearing shorts, flip flops and a tank top. (Yeah I know a lot of motorcycle riders wear the same thing). The rider was obviously hurt and was being tended to by bystanders awaiting EMS arrival. I feel sorry for the individual that was hurt but at the same time I also see this as an accident that affects our statistics. These vehicles are not being licensed, the operators probably are not motorcycle qualified, may even not have a valid driver's license, probably are not carrying the minimum liability insurance coverage required by everyone else using our roadways, but when they are involved in an accident their statistics are charged as a motorcycle accident because they are a two wheeled motorized vehicle and there really isn't any other place to categorize them. The individuals riding these "scooters" don't see themselves as motorcyclists. They seem them as nothing more than motorized bicycles. However these individuals are being involved in traffic crashes and are being hurt as a result of those traffic crashes and the statistics from those crashes are being included in our data. Just something else to think about.

Now that I've left you with a couple of things to think about here's one more. The general election is coming up really soon. I hope each of you have taken the time to get to know the person(s) your being asked to vote for. That you've looked over the various issues that are being placed on the ballot and are ready to exercise your constitutionally protected right to vote. NOW get out there and DO IT!



### **EPA Sends Ethanol Regulations to White House**

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) sent its final regulations to the White House for Presidential approval, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) reports. This is the final step in the approval process before the mandate can be revealed.

Last year, the EPA proposed that the amount of ethanol to be produced by refiners actually be reduced over previous years. This plan to reduce the amount of ethanol being produced sent shockwaves through the energy community. Petroleum users lauded the proposal as a step in the right direction. The MRF testified at a hearing on the proposal in favor of lowering the amount of ethanol and in favor of doing away with the sale E-15. The MRF is also actively supporting legislation to halt the sale of E-15 fuels until further testing can be done.

The proposal was by far one the most controversial ever put forth by the EPA and received over 340,000 public comments. While the EPA announced the White House review, they did not release whether any changes were made to last year's proposal to lower the amount of ethanol to be produced. The EPA will release the final rule after the White House and other federal agencies weigh in. The White House has 90 days to review the proposal and issue a response.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation will keep you informed on this issue.
