<u>Motorcycle Awareness Coordinator</u> – Tricia Ruby (absent) – Spring has arrived and it's a great time for awareness booths at Bike nights and fairs, etc.

Local 30 would like to propose an Awareness booth at the Ozark Empire Fair in Springfield, July 25-Aug 3. A 10 x 10 spot is \$525, or a corner spot is \$625, registration by July 1 and cost includes 20 passes. Asking that Locals 30, 3, 15 & 11 join and host with the assistance of Awareness Fund. Motion made that Awareness Fund take on that fee if we are unable to receive a free space since we are a "Not-For-Profit" organization by L-11 and 2nd by L-13. The original proposal was that each local pay \$105 with Awareness also paying \$105. Yet motion was made for Awareness to cover the entire amount. Motion passed unanimously.

Lake of the Ozarks Bikefest will be September 11-15. Booth to be in front of SNAFU on the strip.

<u>Legislative Coordinator</u> – **Joe Widmer** – All of our bills have passed out of the House, but the Senate is holding things up for some reason or another.

- Modifies provisions relating to requirements for certain off-road vehicles. Adds fiscal responsibility if they are driven on public roads by requiring insurance.
- Requires public schools to offer a driver education course that students must complete before graduating.

- Right to repair that allows authorized individuals or businesses access to information, parts, and tools to perform independent repairs on motorcycles.
- Changes the maximum CC for permitted riders from 250 to 300.
- Motorcycle Profiling Resolution, House passed waiting on Senate.

Personal email jwwidmer2012@hotmail.com the password to the legislative email is locked and can't be changed. Rep. Don Mayhew guest, Chairman of Transportation Accountability. Explained that the same bills are filed in the Senate and House and if passed they TAFP and then it becomes law. Explained the process of bills being heard and voted on in each session. Then how each step in the process for combining bills and conference calls. Then budget issues have taken over and other bills fall to the wayside. Meeting with MODOT and fatalities have increased since the passage of the Helmet Modification. As a former engineer with MODOT he noticed that there are more motorcycles on the roads here. Asked how they counted those stats. Using A.I. and cameras, the weighted average is good, if the perimeters of the study are correct. They can go into special session for a single subject however, the governor can add other subjects. Lobbyists want money spent and sometimes what they want and what we want will cross paths. Know your reps and senators and speak directly to them about good and bad ideas. How many legislators vote for what their constituents want? Some don't know how to do their job due to inexperience and don't know how the process works. If you attended the MAY Rally for the first time and do not have an" I lobbied..." patch contact Smokin' Joe.

MRF - Amy Allmon - Proposal to change the EPA rule about 2/3 of all vehicles sold by 2032 must be electric. Call to action available from MRF to send a letter to your law makers. My phone number is (816) 536-1647, amyallmon69@gmail.com. Bikers Inside the Beltway is May 19-22, if you want to attend, please see me.

<u>Mid-South Mile</u> – Roy "Cowboy" Hoard – Wayne Tipton has volunteered to be chairman of the MILE. Will be in Hot Springs, Arkansas, October 25-27. Need MILE basket items.

Riders Education – BL McDonald – Carl Hammond explained the process of getting the classes ready each weekend. All the bikes need to be maintained, then volunteer their truck to pull trailer to site unload all the bikes then reload at end of the day. Next day unload then after class reload, strap them down, and return to our storage area. In the meantime, do the necessary repairs and do it all again next weekend. Rider Education puts us in contact with younger and women riders and it gave us legitimacy with the legislators.

BL began riding in 1962 as a senior in high school and in 1987 took a rider education course and found out he didn't know "shit" about riding a motorcycle. We want this organization to continue the education program. We need 3 people to attend the Missouri Safety center in Warrensburg to be instructors. When finished with class they need to be dedicated enough to maintain the certification. We may need to pass to another entity. Linn Technical College has expressed interest.

Membership Coordinator - Tricia Ruby (absent) - Tami has nothing to add currently.

Marketing Coordinator- Shauleen Capps – Has no intention of taking over anyone's position. I proposed this position to assist Awareness and Membership. We need to change the way we do a few things. I have created a marketing plan and each of you has a copy. These are just goals: update the trifold. Currently busy and working on a new one that is more eye catching. MODOT been a good partner, but we need to "brand" our promotional and educational materials. Add a QR code that will take them directly to the membership tab on the website. Membership posters for bike shops or retail establishments. Increase our social media presence with photos. Recruiting banners with a QR code. We need new and better tools to grow our organization.

FEW Seminar – Trisha Ruby (absent) – Now a sustaining member of the MRF. Working on a theme for next year, need volunteers for set up. Also need volunteers for classes since the same people keep volunteering for the same class.

Meeting of the Minds – Amy Allmon – There is a work schedule available on Facebook for timekeepers, registration desk, auction room, parking security, etc. Need people to assist with the carnival games for Friday evening. Voluntold DC he is the auctioneer for the event. Rod Huff will ask the owners Phantom Distillery if they could donate to the cause. See the work schedule on the website and send a note to Donna to sign up. The site visit will be Sunday June 9, 2024, at 1pm. Swimming hole has been dug and prepping for sand. Food vendor, DJ/sound, and bands locked down. Only 7 RV spots left. Casey Singleton has volunteered to run the bike show. Doug Hilburn runs bike games. Ms. Show Me Lingerie show with no restrictions. District 4 needs assistance with the sign-in gate. Still looking for a trailer and some repairs are needed. Contact Dragon.

<u>Old Business</u> – By-law proposals have been in print for 30 days as required. Motion made by L-11 to vote on the individual by-law changes 2nd by L-30. There are 8 separate changes mostly due to grammar and modernization of processes. (refer to March Freedom Press for more information) Unanimous voice vote passed.

• 2.1 – Local 30 motion to accept and Local 15 2nd. A unanimous voice vote passed.

- 2.2B Local 11 motion to accept and Local 30 2nd. Discussion regarding the amount of maintenance for life members to receive Freedom Press in the mail. Since it included a specific amount that would need a by-law change for any adjustments. The motion did not pass unanimously.
- 6.9E Local 5 motion to accept and Local 10 2nd. A unanimous voice vote passed. Another motion to change the "are" to "is", was made by Local 1 and Local 13 2nd, a unanimous voice vote passed.
- 8.2 Local 10 motion to accept and Local 15 2nd. Discussion, change is redundant. Roll-call vote 11 yea and 12 nays, must have ¾ vote to pass. Motion does not pass.

8.6 – Local 30 motion to fail and Local 1 2nd. Motion did not pass.

- Addendum to Voting at Central Committee, page 11. Local 11 motion to accept and Local 13 2nd. Discussion cannot change "adopted" but can "revise" and clarification to any 3 months not just the last 3 months. A unanimous voice vote passed.
- Addendum to Local Business, page 14: Part 1. Change MO Bikers Homecoming to Show-Me Rally and changing "should" to "shall". Supporter pins have been phased out. Local 5 motion to accept and Local 13 2nd. Discussion includes the punitive measure of \$50 a month if determined that Local can make contribution and chooses not to. Some locals barely have enough to operate yet these cases will be looked at individually. And Locals can appeal to CC committee for a loan to put on a fundraiser. Amendment to motion by Local 1: remove the words "fail to" and Local 14 2nd. A unanimous voice vote passed. Vote on original motion, a unanimous voice vote passed.
- Addendum to Local Business, page 14: Part 2. Local 1 motion to not accept Local 28. A unanimous voice vote passed. The changes to the price from \$25 to \$30 has not been updated in the by-laws and that will be done with these changes. Motion made by Local 11 to take the General Office off the table and 2nd by Local 30. A unanimous voice vote passed. Motion to resend this proposal made by Local 11 2nd by Local 14. Discussion about the affordability of a general office and we can revisit the issue later. A unanimous voice vote passed.

New Business – Linda Hawkins - Insurance company that we have used in the past is no longer writing the coverage for our unique circumstances. Most other commercial companies are doing the same. What we could find was outrageously priced and offered very little coverage. After further research I was able to locate coverage for nearly the same cost and \$1,000,000 coverage. Meetings and the Statewide toy runs are not covered under this policy. We are covered for 40 events for each year, any additional events will cost an additional \$100 on top of current insurance payment for each event. May need to increase the amount each Local pays for event insurance.

At 3pm, Local 1 made a motion to extend the meeting Local 28. A unanimous voice vote passed.

Missouri Scenic Rides Magazine, we renewed a ¼ page add with a QR code for \$500.

Capture the Flag and each local needs to update contact information including meeting location in Freedom press and with the webmaster.

Local 30 was in distress and now back in order. Article 2 section 2.7. Does not allow transfer to another local under 1 year. Asking that rule to be suspended for individuals that transferred out of L-30 when things started to collapse and allow them to transfer back. Motion made by Local 16 and 2nd by Local 10. A unanimous voice vote passed.

When leaders jump ship, the followers are lost. Proposal to create a mentorship program, to lead young members in the ways of the FORR membership. Volunteers are encouraged to make themselves available to Sparky and assist.

MMSP located in Warrensburg is a State funded organization. Joe and Rep Mayhew are going to look into grant money for training new instructors.





Those bills were, UTV/ATV mandatory insurance if used on public roads, right to repair for motorcycles only, and raising the displacement from 250 cc to 300 cc on motorcycles for instruction permit holders. All of these bills were added as amendments to a senate bill in the house and sent back to the senate and most likely their fate in the conference would have been questionable. I want to thank Rep's Kyle Marquart, Brian Seitz and Lisa Thomas for bringing these bills forward and our support of them. Also, driver's education died, thank you to Rep. Roger Reedy for sponsoring this legislation. And finally a thank you goes out to Rep. Darin Chappell and Sen. Mike Moon for sponsoring our motorcycle profiling resolutions. Expect all this legislation to come back next year and we will be supporting it yet again.

I would like to thank Deanna Rhodes-Widmer for all her hard work on the veterans legislation she was involved with and she got her legislation passed. Congratulations! There's still some legislation that didn't make it on the bill but she will be working on that next year. I would also like to thank her for her help on all the legislation we were supporting and especially the driver's education legislation.

I will hopefully have a list of all the current candidates up for election in August at the July CC meeting for you to look over and ask questions on any of the candidates. I don't know all of the candidates but will try and answer what I can. Remember this is an election year and a very important election year. The Primary is August 6th please get out and vote and also get involved in your local campaigns. If you have any questions please reach out to me.

This week bikers from across the nation descended on Capitol Hill. The 2024 Motorcycle Riders Foundation's (MRF) Bikers Inside the Beltway was the largest in the 15-year history of the event! Motorcyclists from 37 states made the trip to Washington, D.C. to advocate for issues that matter to the street rider.

The list of policy concerns was long! Issues include: Right to Repair, Preserving the Internal Combustion Engine, Profiling of Bikers, Autonomous Vehicles, Ethanol Mandates and the Definition of a Motorcycle.

For the second year in a row, all 435 members of the House of Representatives and 100 Senators received an informational packet from the MRF. The packet explains who we are, what we've done, and what we want. From Alabama to Wyoming and all the states in between, the MRF knocked on doors and shared our legislative priorities.

The nearly 200 bikers who came to Washington, D.C. represented a diverse set of groups. State Motorcyclist Rights Organizations (SMRO), Sustaining Clubs, the National Council of Clubs (NCOC) and the National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM) were all represented as part of the MRF event.

Showing up matters. While it is important that lawmakers hear from us, it is also important that they see us. Every year there is a buzz that occurs on Capitol Hill when hundreds of bikers roam the Halls of Congress. The visual of so many motorcyclists united for a common cause is a powerful part of the annual event.

The MRF is committed to being your voice in Washington, D.C. We have had a presence in town since 1986 and we are not going anywhere! We are and will remain, the voice of the street rider in our nation's capital.

Thank you to all the motorcyclists who made the journey to D.C. It is never too early to start making plans for the next installment of Bikers Inside the Beltway in May 2025.
