Chairman' Corner

What to look for in a Central Committee Rep

There are many different duties in Freedom of Road Riders®. Each of which are very important in the advancement of our mission statement. Among those duties is a Central Committee Representative (CC Rep). This position is voted on in many locals, by the membership of the local. Other locals Presidents may appoint their CC Rep.

The job of the CC Rep is to bring YOUR COLLECTIVE voice to the state floor on all matters. It is also to bring back ALL information gathered at the CC meeting to the membership of their respective local. This duty is probably the most important duty in this great organization. Without a good CC Rep the members of FORR® will not know what is going on at the state level, or what the organization's plans are for the future. When nominating someone for the duty of CC Rep It is very important to select someone that everyone can trust to deliver the will of the members to the floor. This is a democracy and every member's voice matters. A good CC Rep knows their local and will be able to vote on any situation that may arise in the best interest of their local.

What you DO NOT want in a CC Rep is someone who will dismiss the COLLECTIVE VOICE of the local and make decisions on their personal feelings on a matter. Someone that attends CC meetings to party and take no notes or uses that time to take a mini vacation on the local's dime. When giving the CC report in a local meeting, a good CC Rep will be talking for 20-30 minutes. After all, they are reporting a minimum of 4 hour's worth of information gathered from the CC meeting.

In the situation that Bylaws or Policies and Procedures are to be voted on in a CC meeting; every vote is recorded by a roll call vote and printed in the meeting minutes that are printed in the front of the Freedom Press. The purpose of the roll call votes being printed is so you the member know how your CC Rep voted on behalf of your local.

The reason they are moving from new site to old site is the school site had been chopped by one of our old Directors. Doug is working on this to get it fixed and would like to thank Local 19 in Kirksville for their patience during the delay this year, and for their continued support of the Trenton site. Legislative- I filled in for Bill Kempker on Legislative. We're going with 26 yrs. old and health insurance on the Helmet Mod. The most important bill to us this year and we will spend the majority of our focus on is the Right of Way Bill. It went a long way last year and we have to get it all the way this year. Bill is looking at Sponsors. Bill would like to keep it at two bills this year and these are it. If anyone has any questions or thinks there is something else we should be focusing on please get with Bill. Now is the time to talk to the people in your area that are running and see how they feel on our issues. The primary is over so you know who will be in your general in November. To find out for sure check out the Secretary of States web site www.sos.mo.gov . If they are going to be friends of ours please try to help them with their campaign it doesn't always have to be financial, they remember when we put up signs etc. Do whatever we can to help, and let Bill know what their stance is so he can keep track. These are the guys and gals that will be voting on our issues for the next two years, so we need to make as many friends as possible; it is your duty as an American citizen to get out and vote and to make an informed vote, so please do your due diligence. You may not get this in time, but was brought up at the meeting. We are doing scholarships this year for the Meeting of the Minds and Mid-South Mile. Please write a letter to Bill at Legislative@forr.net and CC all the corporate officers. They have to be an active member that has never been to the event they apply for,

please explain why they believe it will be beneficial for them to go, and afterwards they will need to write a report of what they learned, and they can come to CC to present it. It would be nice.

I hope all of you can make these events. I am the Captain of the Auction Banquet team and the whole MOTM committee has been working this diligently. It is going to be a blast for the Meeting of the Minds 30th Anniversary in Kansas City. This is an international Motorcycle Rights conference for the MRF- Motorcycle Rights Foundation in Washington, so we have bikers from all over the nation and Belgium coming. You want to be there to be part of the FORR plan. This will be one they will NEVER FORGET.

We have a lot of events coming up so keep your eye on the newsletter, Facebook, website, or call if you need more information. As always my Framily, I hope to see you soon



Dear Exhibitionist Rider,

It is a beautiful early August day as I write you this letter. Riders are out in numbers enjoying this weather, as I myself will be but I wanted to take a moment to share some good news and some bad news.

First a little good news; as a man ages he has a number of woes he must face. The good news for you is you will never have to worry about such things as prostrate exams or low T counts. You will forever have the body of a 26 year old and even gray hair will not be an issue because you're dead.

Yes, that's the bad news. Because you chose irresponsible riding practices over consideration of your safety and the safety of those sharing the road that last attempt at riding down a curved two lane highway on one wheel at 70 miles per hour cost you your life. It was in fact your LAST attempt.

There is more good news though. Your three year old daughter is young enough her grieving period and missing her daddy will pass quickly. You also will not have to worry about paying for her wedding because that duty will fall to the man your wife chooses to raise her. He will be the one teaching her to ride a bike, protecting her from the monster under the bed and kissing all those boo boo's.

Even better news is your six month old son is still fascinated by his own feet so he barely registers a difference in his daily routine. Both of your children will see pictures of you in the future but you won't even cause them a moment of grief because they won't remember you ever existed. So no need to worry about any lasting effects from your final act of defiance of fate or the odds you played and lost.

Your parents on the other hand are not faring as well as your children or your wife. Husbands can be replaced and step-fathers will fill the void you left but if you ask any parent what it's like to outlive their children they will say the same thing; there is no greater pain! Not to worry they will learn to cope despite the empty place you left in their hearts.

Sadly your final act of arrogance scarred another family and left them with a pain that has changed their lives forever.

Fate is not always cruel. The father driving the truck you hit head on was the only member of their family who actually saw what was about to happen and the impact itself. His wife only had time to register the horror on her husband's face. Unlike him, she did not see your body explode along with your motorcycle. Thankfully their small children were occupied in the backseat of their pickup truck and were unaware until after you hit them. Of course they all had to endure the four hours at the accident scene required to document your gory decision and collect the pieces of your body from among the wreckage of your motorcycle. There is more good news for you. You will not spend the rest of your life being tortured by the vision of your death. You will also not be haunted every day by the "what if's" that could have changed fate for all of you. No, the nightmare of your death will fall to the father of the pickup truck who will forever wonder what if he had chosen to leave home a little earlier or linger a bit longer at the last fuel stop. What if he had given in to his three year old daughter and stopped for that ice cream? Could he have kept his family safe from your decision to give in to a childish notion of grandeur?

You see while the skill so many admire in the new age exhibitionist riders is dazzling it is also only spectacular and to be respected in the proper venues. It is neither appropriate nor impressive when it is used as an attention gaining means of thumbing your nose at others. No stunt double stepped in to fake the final moments of your life. You will not magically reappear in a sequel and you will also not be immortalized as a great riding hero. Quite the contrary little brother the words idiot and fool are being attached to your name when this act of arrogance on your part is discussed. You are dead and that is forever.

Riders come in many forms. We strive for safer travel not just safer crashes. In this case there is more good news for you. That helmet you were raised to believe would protect you from all evil did in fact protect your head beautifully. Except for the damage to your neck where it was ripped from your shoulders your head was unharmed. The newspaper didn't report that fact only that you were indeed "helmeted". Unfortunately there was not enough of your body left intact for an open coffin but that

viewing thing is a bit morbid anyway. You see all that expensive riding gear that looked so flashy while you barreled to your death may have been great for preventing a little road rash but it served no purpose when you hit a full size pickup truck at 70 miles per hour head on.

For those fighting to preserve the right to enjoy the freedom motorcycling represents another blow was dealt against them. The average person does not separate riders into groups. A 50 year old Harley rider is no different than a 26 year old Suzuki sport bike rider in their eyes. That means your act of stupidity was a black mark against all. There is good news in this though too. Those promoting the removal of motorcycles from ALL public thoroughfares as has been done in various locations in Europe have held you up as their super hero. You've added to the numbers they tout in our Capitals as being the reason motorcycles have no place on the roads. They may not remember your name or know anything about the life you threw away but they will insure your death hurts more than just those directly involved in that final act of arrogance. My ride is here so I must sign off now. We don't get weather like this often in August. I don't plan to miss a moment more of the wind in my face or waste even another second wondering what if anything could have been done to wake you up before this happened. My prayer is your death may serve as a reminder of just how short life can be and maybe others will think before they too throw it away. Sincerely,

As usual there will be plenty of informational workshops including Interacting with the Media, Motorist Awareness, Peer-to-Peer Communication, Leadership Development, Event Planning and more. MRF Awareness & Education (MRFA&E) will be introducing a new program aimed toward children. We will have a panel discussion on the ups and downs of a State Motorcycle Rights Organization (SMRO). Fact or Fiction?

There is a safety community in Washington D.C. that is trying to destroy motorcycling as we know it with lies and half truths. This group is a quasi mixture of government and private safety driven organizations including The Center for Auto Safety, Highway Loss Data Institute, the Advocates for Highway and Auto Safety and the Governors Highway Safety Association to name a few. All of these groups work to influence the government to enact stricter and stricter safety standards and laws. They all do this slightly differently from each other but they do have one common core; they hate motorcycles. If they thought it was remotely possible for one minute that they could eliminate all forms of power driven two wheelers from the traffic landscape, they would try. They try to alarm the general public with misinformation or partial information. They claim that motorcyclist fatalities have been on the rise since 2005 and that is true. Some years see a dip but for the most part motorcyclist fatalities have risen. There was an increase of 36 more fatalities between from 2005 to 2011, 4,576 to 4,612 respectively. However, bike sales and registration numbers are up and that tells a very different story. One that they don't want you to hear.

A closer look at the numbers reveals the bulk of the story. They tell us that motorcyclists fatalities are on the rise but they never mention the number of motorcycles on the road, which is also increasing. When we look at the numbers, they show the exact opposite of what the media,

the government and the safety-crats are telling us. In fact, motorcycle fatalities are occurring on a much less frequent basis year after year. Since 2005, fatalities have dropped from 73.5 motorcyclists per one hundred thousand registered motorcycles to 54.7. That is an almost 30% drop in fatalities in the exact same time period in which the fear mongers tell you fatalities are a growing problem. All of the numbers used here are directly from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) website. Separating fact from fiction reveals the truth. Over six years 2.2 million motorcycles were added to the roads and we essentially kept the number of fatalities at a near static number. This is not exactly the end of the world, deathtrap-riding scenario that the powers that be would have you believe. All this considering that the only difference is the Motorcycle Riders Foundation created a federal grant program to send money to the states to assist with rider education and share the road type campaigns. We have also relaxed mandatory helmet laws which goes directly against what they would have you believe.

During the August congressional recess remind your elected officials that since 2005, we have had states repeal helmet laws and have watched fatalities drop. The only significant change to the motorcycle safety world other than more motorcycles, is the National Highway Traffic Administrations motorcycle safety grant program. The same program that was supported by the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. This fund has dispensed money to every state and is used for motorcycle rider education and share the road campaigns. In order to continue the fund we need Congress to pass another transportation bill. Please take advantage of the upcoming congressional recess by contacting your member of congress, attending events and town hall type meetings. Urge them to get to work on the highway bill.

Highway Funding Bill Clears Congress

The United States Congress has agreed on a temporary patch for the highway trust fund, reports the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. The Senate agreed to the House version of the temporary funding fix for the highway trust fund.

The fix came just hours before the United States Department of Transportation would have had to cut off payments for highway construction projects and mass transit programs. The quick fix will keep the trust fund solvent through mid May of 2015.

The final Senate vote ended a week of legislative ping ponging between the House and Senate. The Senate wanted to modify the legislation so it would expire in December of 2014, thus forcing a vote on a larger highway bill that would address the trust fund issues before the end of this year. The House defeated that legislation, sending its own version to be passed by the Senate, that will run through May and spends \$10.8 billion. The temporary patch kicks the larger issues into the next Congress to be sworn in next year.

Happy Jack, AZ.: Federal authorities in Arizona are warning off-highway-vehicle riders

to be wary of booby-trapped trails in the Coconino National Forest near Happy Jack. Recently, trail riders reported the tires of their all-terrain vehicles and off-highway motorcycles were punctured by rebar spikes that were sharpened and partially buried in trails heavily used by responsible enthusiasts and their families.

To date, no injuries have been reported. But the sabotage endangers riders, hikers and even animals.

"The end of the rebar has been flattened and sharpened to a point, and the exposed point has been painted to blend in with the road surface," Mogollon Rim District Ranger Linda Wadleigh said in a statement. "The objects pose a serious threat to everyone, and that doesn't just mean people recreating on a motorcycle or OHV, it includes people walking, hiking and even wildlife. We are taking this very seriously and asking the public to keep an eye out and report suspicious activity in the area."

Forest officials want anyone with any information about who set the spikes to call U.S. Forest Service law enforcement officers at (928) 527-3511.

Sacramento, CA.: The AMA has initiated a petition drive to convince the California Office of Administrative Law to allow state agencies to once again disseminate important information on safely and responsibly executing the motorcycling technique called lane splitting.

A recent Office of Administrative Law order resulted in the California Highway Patrol, the Department of Motor Vehicles and other agencies removing CHP lane-splitting guidelines from their websites and ridding their offices of pamphlets, fliers and other documents that contained the safety information.

The CHP also removed references to lane splitting from its online FAQ, where information had been available long before the agency released its guidelines early in 2013. The AMA supports the continued use of safe lane splitting in California and the implementation of lane-splitting laws in other states, coupled with extensive rider and driver education programs.

The AMA position statement reads, in part: "Reducing a motorcyclist's exposure to vehicles that are frequently accelerating and decelerating on congested roadways can be one way to reduce front- and rear-end collisions for those most vulnerable in traffic."

The AMA petition seeks to demonstrate to the OAL that its narrow interpretation of CHP Commissioner J.A. Farrow's promise not to "issue" the guidelines jeopardizes thousands of California motorcyclists, automobile and truck drivers and visitors to the state, because they are being denied access to safety information that affects their roadway environment.

Chicago, **IL**.: The Chicago City Council's Committee on Finance held a July 28 hearing to consider a proposed ordinance that would compel self-serve fueling stations to install costly E15 fuel pumps. E15 is a gasoline blend that includes up to 15 percent ethanol by volume.

Use of E15 fuel in motorcycles is not only illegal, but inadvertent misfueling with E15 may cause engine and fuel system failure and can void manufacturers' warranties. E15 is not approved for use in any of the nation's 11 million motorcycles.

Aldermen Anthony Beale, Edward Burke, Ameya Pawar and Timothy Cullerton and Alderwoman Carrie Austin introduced legislation titled "Amendment of Municipal Code Chapter 4-108 by adding new Section

4-108-76 to require self-service filling stations to use equipment that dispenses mid-grade E15 gasoline."

The AMA opposes the ordinance because it will promote the expansion of the E15 fuel market in an area with a large motorcyclist population. Following the AMA Action Alert issued on July 25, many motorcyclists made their views known to the council. After a five-hour debate, the committee took no vote on the proposed ordinance.

The proposed ordinance is still alive and the issue may come before the committee again as early as September.

Trenton, NJ: The AMA presented research data and assistance to the East Coast Enduro Association during discussions with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection in an effort to reopen some existing off-highway motorcycle trails in New Jersey state forests that were closed by administrative action in 2012.

During a two-and-a-half-hour meeting at the DEP headquarters in Trenton, the AMA-chartered ECEA outlined its objection to the DEP's current policy that restricts enduro and other events to blacktop, gravel and sand and woods roads, with off-road travel limited to existing fire cuts.

Steve Salisbury, AMA off-road government affairs manager, and Danielle Fowles, AMA grassroots coordinator, presented the DEP with information about the positive economic impact of off-highway-vehicle use. The pair also offered advice on the use of volunteers and other trail-management solutions.

The DEP's policy change -- called the menu system -- initially was presented to the ECEA in 2009. The original draft of the plan included the OHV trails, and DEP staff members requested from the ECEA the GPS coordinates for the trails.

When the final plan was issued in 2012, the ECEA trails had been eliminated with no further discussion, said ECEA President Jamie Theurkauf.

During the meeting, Ray Cantor, chief adviser to DEP Commissioner Bob Martin, told the ECEA that he would listen to ECEA recommendations, present them for DEP consideration and then provide feedback to the OHV community in future discussions.

West Milord, NJ: Local representatives plan to duplicate an earlier effort by the state by soliciting insured operators to run an OHV park in town. West Milford's governing body recently authorized the distribution of a request for proposals seeking an insured organization that would be willing to lease a municipal property for use as an ATV park.

The township is likely to put out a request for proposals similar to that designed by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection for the Mount Pleasant State Off-Road Vehicle Park in Cape May County. Acquired in November 2011 from the former Mount Pleasant Sand and Gravel Pit, the property features acres of terrain as well as a course from its old motocross track. For now, the state runs the park on weekends in the warmer months.

Olympia, **WA**: The Department of Licensing has updated the declaration form riders will need when registering their ATVs for use on certain roads. Visit the DOL website for the latest information: http://www.dol.wa.gov/vehicleregistration/watv.html
