Opened with Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call of Locals. Local 1 made a motion to approve the minutes as printed, Local 14, 2nd. The Motion passed unanimously with no discussion. Please place phones on silent or you will be charged \$1 to the PAC fund.

Chairman - Joe "DC" Karr

Membership is declining, what are we doing to retain the members we have? It is recommended that CC reps attend the Saturday Committee meetings because there are details and strategies for moving forward discussed. We need to keep the drama to a minimum, and not air dirty laundry on social media. Discuss with the Local cabinet or the State cabinet to solve the problem. Rider's Ed was the only department that was self-sustaining, and we could not get a coordinator or coaches. The storage unit fee was 3 months behind. BL has brought it up to date and Local 10 has moved everything out of storage and a member has agreed to store the equipment. We are discussing our options in selling or passing off the program to MDOT or Linn Technical College. Local 15 made a motion to begin shopping around for another entity to pass off the Riders Ed department and begin liquidating the equipment. Duchess does have the titles for the trailers but attempting to contact Beth and locate the bike titles. Local 11 2nd the motion. Motion passes unanimous voice vote. Local 5 made a motion to place a deadline for a plan of action by the next CC meeting in September and 2nd by Local 1. Motion passed unanimously.

Motorcycle Awareness Coordinator – Tricia Ruby – Provided an awareness info folder and recommended having challenge coins available. Awareness that the hands-free law enforcement begins soon and other information regarding rider safety. Revealed a new awareness banner that includes a QR code for the home page of our website. Shift schedule for Ozark Empire Fair awareness booth. Please sign up. Lake of the Ozarks Bikefest will be September 11-15. Booth to be in front of SNAFU on the strip.

Legislative Coordinator – Joe Widmer – Big thanks to Tricha for setting up the MAY Rally. There are some candidates we need to consider donating to their campaign. Senator Mike Moon and Rep. Darrin Chappell, Local 11 made motion that we send \$200 to each and Local 1 2nd the motion. Motion passes with unanimous voice vote. Fatalities remained the same for the last few weeks last year at this time they were 70 and this year they stand at 54. Just a little tidbit is that 2/3 of the rider fatalities were wearing helmets.

Prefiling begins December 1 need to start thinking about our priorities for next year. Right to repair, driver education, and change the maximum CC for permitted riders from 250 to 300. These were added to a single bill at the end of the session but were not passed. Motorcycle Profiling Resolution was voted out of committee but went no further. We need to think about Lane Filtering, even though we are not too keen on it. There are six other States where it is legal and don’t think Missouri is ready for that. A lot of States are doubling down on Federal issues such as gasoline remaining available and the choice of vehicle to purchase. Deanna was able to get her language on an Omnibus Veterans bill regarding State services.

August 6 primary and provided a list of the candidates for State officers and Senators. Could not include Representatives since there 260 of them.

Mid-South Mile – Roy “Cowboy” Hoard – Will be held in Hot Springs, Arkansas, October 25-27. Need MILE basket items. The MILE trailer is parked at my place and the emblems for Missouri and Texas are faded and would like for Shelly to provide new stickers for the trailer. Shaulene would like to video everyone reciting the preamble for a YouTube video for marketing. See her on the patio.

Riders Education – BL McDonald – Report and discussion was included at the beginning since BL had to leave.

Membership Coordinator – Tricia Ruby – not much more to add, we need to increase our numbers. Dragon from Local 1 proposed that we offer a “Sustaining Membership” available to any business, club, individual, or group who believes in motorcyclist rights and freedom. He brought the idea from ABATE of Michigan. He also stated that each State officer had a submission in the newsletter. Local 30 made a motion to have each officer place a submission to the Freedom Press 2nd by Local 15. Passed by unanimous voice vote. Local 24 will expand their outreach to family events.

Product Line – Shelly Noel. Contact her (660) 251-3904 or photobyshelly@yahoo.com. Silk screen items are in the works. Head bands, earrings, lapel pins, do rags, etc. At the Freedom Rally there were 2 people she met that had once been FORR members then moved away and now have moved back and wish to rejoin. They visited 2 locals and got into knock down drag out fights at each. Need to remember that we can disagree and argue but keep the drama out. You can lose members and prospective members.

Marketing Coordinator- Shauleen Capps – Handed out packets to each CC representative. In each are 2 new trifolds they have typos that will be corrected. Each Local received 10 of each design and that left 180 of each for the Ozark Empire Fair. The cost was \$.30 each folded. Also, there are 5 posters with a QR code and space to write a phone number for a local contact. The cost of the posters was \$.52 each. We are building a “toolbox” for the Locals. Partnership with Tricia on the education materials to create rack cards that are pocket friendly and less likely to be tossed out. She would like to focus on social media and that is an avenue to promote our organization and possibly catch the attention of the younger generation. Currently planning a podcast with BL, Halfbreed and Carl Hammond for a roundtable discussion. Showed short clips of ABATE of Iowa and how they use it for promotion. Show Me Rally/Homecoming – Jim Fitzsimonds - Show Me Rally presented by Freedom of Road Riders, August 23-25. We lost the band on Saturday night, and we were able to secure The Supermatics. The food vendor locked down; other vendors signed but not paid. Sewing lady, Shelly custom catering, our Shelly with product line, 2 wheels down leather vendor. Still need work shifts to be filled. We do not currently have a beer vendor; Joe is working on that issue. The highway banner was destroyed by tornado, so we need to make sure direction signs are posted. Designing your own bikini and frozen underwear for couples are ideas for activities. Went over schedule of events. Remember to return all sold and unsold bike tickets. If tickets are lost who is responsible for the loss? The Local should be responsible for paying for lost tickets. Motion from Local 28 to leave as is and if tickets are lost then they are just lost. 2nd by Local 14, Motion does not pass. Local 1 made a motion that the Locals that checked out the tickets are responsible for those tickets for State Give Aways, by returning money and stubs, reporting lost and return unsold. Motion 2nd by Local 15. Discussion concluded. Local 30 made motion to table this motion to discuss with each Local and 2nd by Local 11, motion passed to table this motion. Local 6 made motion the individual who signed the tickets out from the Local would be responsible for the tickets, 2nd by Local 24. 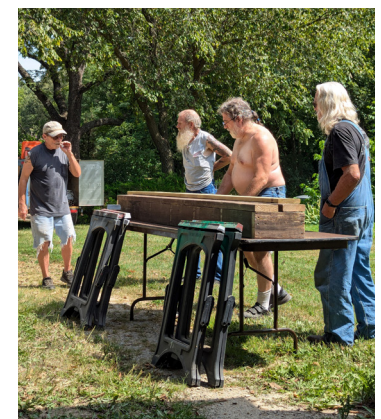

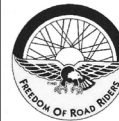

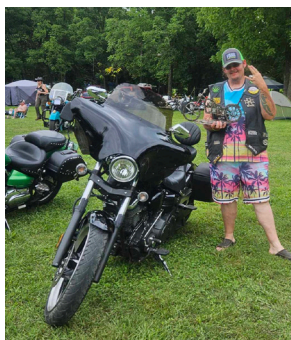

2022 Traffic Safety Facts for Motorcycles

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) released their 2022 Traffic Safety Facts for Motorcycles. The 15-page report details motorcycle safety data including geographic, demographic and other factors in crashes and fatalities involving bikers.

As is often the case, how statistics are framed can shape the narrative surrounding the numbers. NHTSA lists "Key Findings" from the report. Some of the major findings include:

- In 2022 there were 6,218 motorcyclists killed, 15% of all traffic fatalities. An increase of 1% from the previous year
- An estimated 82,687 motorcyclists were injured in 2022, a 3% decrease from 84,898 motorcyclists injured in 2021.
- 35% of motorcycle riders involved in fatal crashes in 2022 were not properly licensed.
- 42% of motorcycle riders who died in single-vehicle crashes in 2022 were alcohol-impaired.

On these four points, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) has a strong message, too many bikers are being killed and injured on our nation's roadways! It is unacceptable that 15% of deaths on the road are motorcyclists. An easy and obvious way to help bring that number down is to ensure those on motorcycles are properly trained and licensed to operate motorcycles. Additionally, the number of alcohol-impaired deaths is disgraceful. Reducing or eliminating impaired riding would make a dramatic difference to these numbers.

However, some of the points made in the report are spun in a way we find troubling. For example, NHTSA lists as one of its key findings:

- In States without universal helmet laws, based on known helmet use, 54 percent of motorcyclists killed in 2022 were not wearing helmets, as compared to 11 percent in States with universal helmet laws.

What is not highlighted is that 63% of all fatalities nationwide involved a rider wearing a helmet, based on known helmet use. Additionally, the lack of a mandate to wear a helmet doesn't mean a motorcyclist can't wear one. It just means that those riding are allowed to decide for themselves. This fact is spotlighted by the fact that 11 of 32 states without a mandatory helmet law (Alaska, Arizona, Connecticut, Florida, Idaho, Missouri, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Texas, Utah and Wyoming), had the same number or more deaths among riders wearing helmets as without helmets.

MRF President Kirk "Hardtail" Willard quipped, "Looks like NHTSA won't stop until all bikers killed are wearing a helmet!"

Another point to note is that an estimated 4.1 billion more miles were ridden on motorcycles in 2022 than the previous year. This is a 21% increase in miles traveled while fatalities only increased by 1%, showing that while the number of fatalities increased, the rate of fatalities per mile traveled decreased. One of NHTSA's "Key Findings" for this report is that motorcycles in 2022 had a 26.16% fatality rate per mile traveled. They do not point out that in 2021 that same rate was 31.27%, giving motorcycles a reduction in fatalities of 5.11%. Meanwhile, passenger car fatalities dropped 0.07% and light trucks dropped 0.04% based on miles traveled.

Some other facts from the report:

- 35% of all motorcycle riders involved in fatal crashes in 2022 were speeding.
- 66% of fatalities occurred in urban areas.
- 36% of fatal crashes occurred at an intersection.
- 58% of deaths happened during daylight hours.
- 92% occurred on non-interstate roads.

It is also important to note that according to NHTSA, "For the purposes of this fact sheet, motorcycles include 2- and 3-wheeled motorcycles, off-road motorcycles, mopeds, motor scooters, minibikes, and pocket bikes." However, in a move the MRF applauds, motorized bicycles (previously included in these numbers), have been removed from the motorcycle category and will now be categorized as bicycles.

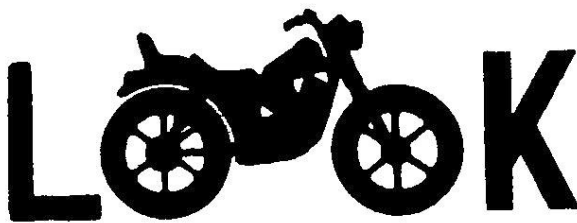

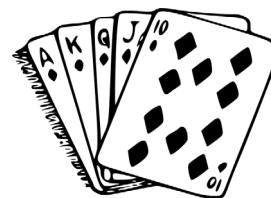
